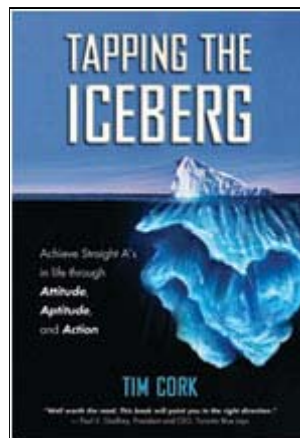
This day-long workshop features a slate of great speakers to help get your job search started.
